OFFICER REPORTS:

No officers in attendance. DI requested a report next parliament session for all non-attending officers.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

LC presented a paper regarding introducing a scheme to grow vegetables on campus in order to help with students' mental health and potentially help stock the food pantry. LC stated that he understands that space at Birkbeck is limited, however a rooftop space would also work well and noted that vertical growing methods save space. DI suggested that this could be a society, it would also help with student engagement in the scheme. FC agreed with this, he is active in both the environmental society as well as the climate action society and stated that he'd be happy to discuss the scheme there. The parliament was happy for LC to set up a gardening society, and looks forward to hear about the progress.

MJ reminded parliament that the week commencing 13/05/24 is mental health week and asked for help with spreading awareness.

DI reminded parliament to complete the award nomination form.

DS discussed two issues. First that there has been inconsistent information given to her regarding mitigating circumstances and the second that she has notices that many students don't engage in seminars but still have good grades. She suggested asking the college to ensure that engagement in



class is marked. DI stated that DS should reach out to SU-Voice for signposting regarding the mitigating circumstances issue. VP stated that the lack of engagement is common across courses and she also had similar discussions as a course rep. VP conducted research and found that Birkbeck students are 300% more likely to have anxiety than the general student population. She suggested that this could be a reason for non-engagement and thus students should not be forced to contribute. DI ended the debate.

EW asked for student parliament feedback via email. VP stated that students should be given a document containing the contact email for course staff. EW agreed that this is a good idea. EW also stated that the Student Union is considering removing academic reps next year and considering all course reps as student parliament members. Parliament consensus was that this is a good idea. Finally, EW stated that parliament elections may be in June or July next year to allow parliament to start earlier. VP suggested a may election.
