Projects and Updates:

Positive Messaging Campaign

This campaign aims to promote positivity and kindness across campus, recognising that university life can be demanding for students at all levels. Through empowering quotes from students and alumni, along with interactive "Positive Messaging Walls," we are transforming previously underused spaces into areas of inspiration, kindness, and community connection.

Renovation of Birkbeck's Multi-Faith Room

In line with my commitment to fostering an inclusive and welcoming environment, we have completed several key improvements in the Multi-Faith Room, including:

- Installation of comfortable carpeting,
- Energy-efficient LED lighting,
- Freshly repainted walls and door,
- Enhanced ventilation and air conditioning,
- New seating with integrated storage.

Additionally, we have added a selection of spiritual texts for communal use, and the website has been updated to reflect these changes.

Wobble Week

Wobble Week is designed to support students during the critical period a few weeks into the term when academic and social pressures can feel overwhelming. This initiative focuses on raising awareness of available support resources, normalising the challenges students face, building resilience, and strengthening community bonds. Working closely with the university, we have organised several events beginning on November 4th, with further updates to be provided at the next Student Parliament meeting.

Welcome Week Events

Welcome Week featured numerous events that I attended and helped coordinate. I hosted the "Afternoon Tea with the Vice-Chancellor" and a campus-wide Treasure Hunt, as well as leading the Pub Quiz and assisting with Karaoke Night. Additionally, I participated in the Freshers Fair, the "Big Birkbeck Welcome," and other activities to ensure a warm introduction to campus life for all new students.



Food Pantry Initiative

The Food Pantry group has held initial meetings to discuss its ongoing operations and future vision. Our first session this year saw high participation, highlighting the significant demand for this resource. Further updates on expansion and access will be shared soon.

New Student Spaces

Following my advocacy last year, new student spaces are now under construction. I continue to provide feedback and collaborate with the university to create welcoming, functional areas for all students.

The general feeling is that this year the university has a lot of organization issues (and I have a very bad experience too). This is something that we have to tackle before it is too late.
